What You Need to Know to Have a Great Golf Year

General

- First Day of Play May 6, 2021. Tee times starting at 4:00 PM
- League play will be on Thursday afternoons May 6 - September 16 with Tee Times starting at 4:00 PM
- Golfers of all abilities age 18 and older are invited to play
- You may choose to play 9 or 18 holes each week (Daily game is only 9 holes)
- All play will be from the RED tees

Tee Time Registration/Cancellation/Changes

- Tee time registration is available 10 days in advance on-line, or two weeks if called in to Golf Shop.
- Do not register anyone for play without their prior consent
- Weekly tee time will be posted online by 5 pm the Wednesday before Thursday play; please make any necessary changes or cancellations prior to 5 pm Wednesday for that week's event
- Late sign-ups will be on a space-available basis

Handicapping/Net Scoring

- The purpose of the USGA Handicap System is to make the game of golf more enjoyable by enabling players of differing abilities to compete on an equitable basis.
- It is the players responsibility to turn in all scores played with the league and outside the league to the Golf Shop for recording
- Some events will be flighted and winners will be determined by net scoring
- Ties will be decided by a scorecard playoff, beginning with the most difficult hole

Rules of Play

- USGA rules of golf will govern all play
- Local rules will be observed
- It is the player's responsibility to know and abide by rules of play
- Breach of rules will result in disqualification

Scoring/Rules Disputes

- Players are responsible for keeping an accurate score in accordance with the Rules of Golf
- The official scorecard must be returned with two signatures attesting the accuracy of each player's score
- The scorekeeper should write in each player's score on the following tee box; settle any concerns at that time
- Questions about the rules or disputes must be resolved with the tournament director immediately following play and before signing card

Prize Fund and Golf Shop Credit Awards

- Weekly prize funds will be determined based on the day's event and participation. Funds will be distributed at the end of the season awards dinner.
- Golf shop credits are good for merchandise only
- Golf shop credits will expire on December 31, 2021
- Your golf shop credit balance is available at the golf shop counter

Inclement Weather

- Cancellation of the day's event due to inclement weather will be solely at the discretion of the tournament committee; you will be notified via email
- The forecast for bad weather does not constitute a reasonable excuse for cancellation

Pace of Play

- 9 holes should be completed in approximately 2 hours, 18 holes in 4 hours
- Penalty strokes may be assessed for being out of position on the course
- Encourage others to keep the pace and offer tips to newer players on how to do so
- A faster pace on the course can actually improve your performance, and will certainly improve the experience for all of those following you

We'll begin the season with a quick meeting to go over league format, rules and address any questions you may have before league play starts on May 6. Light appetizers will be served. You are strongly encouraged to make tee times and form your groups ahead of time. April 29 - Opening Meeting @ 5:30 PM

May 6 - Scramble

In scramble format, each player hits a tee shot and the team determines the best one and everyone then plays their second shot from that position. Continue this process until the ball is in the hole. Two tee shots from each player must be used.

May 13 - Individual Stroke Play

Each player will play her own ball and count *every single stroke and follow the rules of golf*. This will give you a true measure of your improvement throughout the season and will help you to establish an accurate handicap. Players in a group will attest the other players score and post it to your handicap record.

May 20 - Mystery Game

This is an individual stroke play event. However, the scoring format will be a mystery until after the round is complete. A winning format will be chosen at random and revealed as players finish the round. The potential winning format has an equal change of rewarding poor play as well as good play.

May 27 - Partner Blind Draw (best ball)

You play with anyone you want. You won't know who your scoring partners are until after the round. Drawing cards at random will decide teams. Best score for each hole among teammates determines winners.

June 3 - Karma Golf

This is an individual stroke play event. Each Karma Team will receive a special Karma Ball at the beginning of the round. Players alternate playing the Karma ball throughout the round (one hole at a time), recording the Karma Score on the score card while also keeping an individual score for handicapping purposes. Teams returning the Karma Ball at the end of the round will receive a special treat. Don't lose the Karma Ball!

June 10 - Contest Holes

- #1 Shortest Drive

- #2 Closest in 2 Shots
- #3 Furthest From the Pin But On The Green In 1 Shot
- #4, #5 Longest Drive
- #6 Closest to the Pin
- #7 Shortest Drive
- #8 Most Accurate (Straightest Drive - Closest to the Rope)
- #9 Closest to the Lake Without Going In

June 17 - Help from the Pro

Trevor will be assisting on Hole #5. You can choose to have Trevor hit your tee shot or your second shot. The option is yours, but you must decide on the tee box before hitting.

June 24 - Best/Worst on Even Holes

Simple. The lowest or highest net scores on the even-numbered holes wins in each flight. Best/Worst will be determined at the end of the round.

July 1 - Nine & Wine (plus 3 secret holes)

Play nine and then enjoy some appetizers and wine specials on the patio. This is an individual stroke play event. To add to the fun, 3 holes will be secretly selected and revealed after play. A prize will be awarded the person with the combined *highest* score on the 3 holes.

July 8 - Flag Tournament

By this point in the season you should have an established handicap. At check-in you will receive a flag with that number (your handicap) on it. The goal for the tournament is to finish the round (PAR of 36) plus your course handicap. *For example: You are playing 9 holes and the par is 36. Your 9-hole course handicap is 21. The goal would be to finish in under 57 strokes.* Place your flag behind the green if you are successful, or place it on the course where your final handicap stroke comes to rest.

July 15 - Mystery Holes

For the day's event, five holes will be chosen for scores to determine the winners. However, the holes will be a mystery until you finish your round!

July 22 - No Putts

Do putt out and keep your total score. You must record your strokes AND your number of putts on each hole. After play, deduct your putts and half your handicap.

July 29 - 4-Club Tournament + Putter

Only 4 clubs will be allowed: Driver, Spoon or Baffy (1 fairway wood or hybrid), Mashie or Mashie Niblick (1 middle iron), Jigger (9 iron or any wedge), and Putter. Golf cars will be referred to as buggies, and push carts will be referred to as trolleys. Best dressed vintage golfer will receive a prize.

August 5 - Queens on the Greens

Closest to the pin contest on Par 3 holes. Players will track their total number of putts from the green surface (using your putter from off the green will not count) and low putts in each flight will win a prize.

August 12- Mystery Game #2 August 22 - You Pick 'Em - 3 Hole Tournament with 33% Handicap

You will pick one par three, one par four, and one par five on the nine holes. These three holes will be added and you will receive 33% of your course handicap.

August 19 - League Championship

Our league championship will crown the winners from each flight. Everyone, despite your perceived ability, is invited to play. A cookout on the patio will follow the event and spouses are invited to attend. A RSVP will be required 1 week prior to the event.

August 26 - Best/Worst on Odd Holes

Simple. The lowest or highest net scores on the odd-numbered holes wins in each flight. Best/Worst will be determined at the end of the round.

September 2 - Member-Member Best Ball

Pick your partner or be paired with another single player for this 2-Person team event. Both players will play their own ball tee to green and the low net score will count toward the team's score.

September 16 - Individual Stroke Play

Each player will play her own ball and count *every single stroke and follow the rules of golf*. This will give you a true measure of your improvement throughout the season and will help you to establish an accurate handicap. Players in a group will attest the other players score and post it to your handicap record.

September 23 - Golf & Member Dinner

Come out for the season's last golfing event (weather permitting) followed by our annual year-end dinner and end-of-season party. Even if you are not playing golf on this day, you are invited to dinner. Please RSVP by Sept 20.
